RE—OPENING OF OUR CHURCHES The Parish Council together with Fr Martin is currently putting plans in place for the safe re-opening of our churches on Monday 29th June. The Irish Catholic Bishops have published a detailed framework document to assist with the return of Public Liturgies available on WWW.killaloediocese.ie. The main points are:

Each church must identify a team of volunteers to help with cleaning and stewarding. The dispensation from the Sunday and Holy Day obligation is extended for the time being. If unwell you should not attend Mass. Numbers attending must be kept below 50 and social distancing (presently 2 meters) will apply. Seating has been marked out indicating the areas where people can sit allowing one person to sit at the end of each free row while members of the same household attending mass are asked to sit in the same seat. It is recommended that Holy Communion should only be received on the hand for the time being. Priests and Eucharistic ministers should wear face-covering while distributing Holy Communion as well as visibly sanitising their hands both before and after the distribution of Holy Communion. All Holy Water Fonts should be emptied.

Hand Sanitisers should be provided.

Church doors should be kept open when people are arriving and departing for Mass. The Collection Basket should not be distributed. In all circumstances the bishops have emphasised that the safety and health of people, ministers, and priests must be paramount. No church should be opened for public prayer or worship until satisfactory arrangements, as indicated on the Framework have been put in place.

We are calling on parishioners to volunteer their time to help with stewarding, cleaning, and other essential ministries that are developing ensuring that the return to mass will be a safe place for everyone. ONLINE BEREAVEMENT INFORMATION TALK: The death of a person can send ripples throughout the community. Bereavement not only affects the family, but also friends, work colleagues, teachers and neighbours. Following the death of someone close, we may experience strong and conflicting emotions. Grief can be powerful and feel overwhelming. Anyone affected by grief is invited to view this pre-recorded talk, which is designed to give general information on grief and bereavement to bereaved people, their family and friends. Please allow yourself some quiet time to listen to the talk. It may be helpful to listen with someone else for support or, if that is not possible, to talk to someone over the phone afterwards. The information is recorded in two parts, which are approximately 35 minutes in total. You may like to light a candle to remember the deceased or have a photograph of them beside you as you listen to the presentation.
