“We were founded in Galway in the early 1800’s to bring education to the rural poor of Ireland. We were noted in particular for our work with the poor especially during famine times. We also established the first agricultural college in Ireland in Mountbellew Co Galway in 1904. We have missions in rural Kenya and Uganda and run agricultural colleges in both countries. Education, we feel is a vital key to progress. During times of drought, famine and conflict we help where we can. We are especially involved in reconciliation, the distribution of food, water and medicine during difficult times.”

We look forward to hearing Br Brian speaking next weekend and to learn how we can support the work of the Franciscan Brothers spiritually and financially.
