The Canaanite Woman's Faith

The Canaanite woman represents the pagan, idolatrous, and unbelieving world. Jewish people of lesus's time didn't think that such people deserved to be saved by God. They thought it was right to



reject her. Jesus did come to speak to the Hebrew people first. But it seems out of character for Him to use this comparison to a dog. Was He calling attention to the prejudice way of thinking that people of that time had? Was He actually putting down the woman? Or was it simply an illustration of Jesus sitting at the table with the Hebrew people while a pagan/Gentile woman saw the specialness of Jesus and sat under the table, like a dog, waiting for some kind of morsel. The latter seems to be the case because this Canaanite woman's humility and faith shined very brightly to Jesus, and He granted her request. A lot of Jewish people only saw Jesus as a rabbi, but this woman saw him as a Saviour. The woman "under the table" showed more faith than the people sitting at the table. www.crosstalk.com
