emergency' which reflects that 85% of habitats, and 30% of species have 'unfavourable conservation status'. Habitat loss is one of the main pressures affecting biodiversity. This initiative aims to manage 30% of church grounds for biodiversity which will comprise a range of measures such as providing a haven for pollinators, installing bird nest boxes and bat roost boxes; planting mini-orchards comprising native Irish tree species, native tree planting, eradicating invasive species, reducing pesticide use and chemicals. It will involve reimagining how we manage our grounds to benefit biodiversity in the future. I have signed us up for a pilot scheme in Clare in which 10 parishes will work closely with the local community in partnership with the Laudato Si' Working Group of the Irish Bishop's Conference, Clare County Council's Biodiversity Office and the National Biodiversity Data Centre. This also helps achieve goals set under the Clare Biodiversity Action Plan.'
