Reflection – 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time



As the liturgical year
nears its close, the
readings for this
Sunday turn our
attention toward the
end times, not to
frighten us, but to
refocus us.

Jesus speaks of upheaval, uncertainty, and the collapse
of what seems permanent. Yet the heart of the message
is not doom; it is *steadfastness*.

In a world that often feels unstable, Jesus invites His
followers to remain faithful, not clinging to earthly
securities but rooted in God's enduring presence. The
Gospel reminds us that discipleship is not measured by
external success or comfort, but by perseverance,
integrity, and trust in God's promises.

The readings challenge us to examine our priorities: Are
we placing our hope in things that cannot last? Or are we
living in a way that reflects God's kingdom even in
difficult times?

Ultimately, this Sunday teaches that while the world may
shift around us, God remains constant. By staying faithful
in small daily acts; justice, mercy, patience, we become
signs of hope. Our endurance, Jesus tells us, is not
wasted: *"By your perseverance you will save your lives."*
