To address the sensitive issue of compassionate care at the end of life, and in response to the need to inform the faithful of Catholic teaching on this important life issue that affects so many families, the Bishops of Ireland have published the pastoral letter. "Freedom to Live Fully, Until Death Comes" and a video "Through the Valley". They assert that every person possesses inherent, infinite dignity that remains intact regardless of their circumstances. Bishops strongly oppose the Oireachtas Committee's proposal to legislate for assisted suicide, and call on support for healthcare workers who uphold
