On this day we are invited into **memory
and gratitude**, remembering those who
have gone before us, giving thanks for
the lives they lived, acknowledging our
connection to them.

At the same time, it is a day of **hope
and trust** in the promise of resurrection.
Jesus, in raising the widow's son shows
the power of God over death and
reaffirms his promise of eternal life. We recognise
death's reality, our grief, our sense of loss, but we also
look forward in hope to the fullness of life with God.

Finally, it is a day of **intercession and communion**: of
the living praying for the deceased, of the Church as a
whole, the living, the saints, those departed being united.
Our prayers, visits, and the lighting of candles become
gestures of love for those who have passed and of
solidarity with one another.

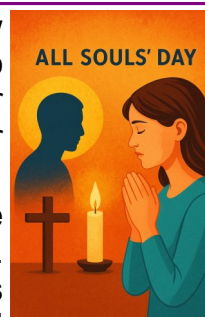
What this might mean for us?

We might take time to visit a grave, light a candle or
pause and name a loved one who has died, entering into
our shared human vulnerability.

We might allow ourselves to sit with grief, not rushing it,
but letting it surface, knowing we are not alone in it.

We might renew our trust in the promise that death does
not have the final word, that in Christ there is life beyond
death. And so we live with gentleness, remembering that
our lives are bound up with others, seen and unseen.

In this way, All Souls' Day becomes more than a solemn
remembrance, it becomes a moment of healing, of
connection, of hope. We honour the past, we pray for
what is unseen, and we live now in the light of eternity.
